

HOFFMAN, BARNEY & FOSCARI POP ABSTRACTISM CAR VINYL WRAP |

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In collaboration with the Production and Licensing Division of Hoffman, Barney & Foscari Pop Abstractism - once (or possibly before) publishing on its official website hoffmanbarneyfoscari.com the new abstractism diversification for high-end cars for markets with a high rate of luxury automotive brands such as the United Arab Emirates and the United Kingdom - must enter into agreements with a company technically responsible for the production, printing and application of the aforementioned abstractism on the intended car. Technically, companies such as Vinyl Frog state the following: "An aftermarket vinyl product used to completely or partially cover the exterior of a vehicle, available in a wide range of colours, finishes and textures. Depending on the choice, it completely renews the car's look or gives it a customised livery. It is also possible to decorate with large vinyl graphics or stickers". For practical reasons related to both logistics and insurance - the emir who orders our abstract design for his Lamborghini or the tycoon in London who wants a customised version of our abstract patterns for the bodywork of his Bentley - at least three similar companies should be identified and registered for each country of penetration for this product sector so that the operation can be carried out on site, i.e. where the vehicle is located. This is to reduce costs and avoid potential limitations resulting from ongoing regulatory changes in logistics, transportation, insurance, and customs duties. The original oversized acrylic painting created specifically for the customer will be sold to the latter either as a full package, including the original work, or separately. When not periodically exhibited in art exhibitions organised by HBF Events and Exhibitions in collaboration with galleries in London or worldwide, in general, and as per the destination of the original work for that particular customer and their vehicle. It will be possible to order a Hoffman, Barney & Foscari Pop Abstract painting that is not handmade but completely created using artificial intelligence.
